Message from JOE SINGLETON, PRESIDENT ROARD OF DIRECTORS



As you may already know, Our Community Foundation was organized in 2021 as part of a separation agreement with the

Community Foundation Alliance to form a standalone community foundation to serve Daviess County. With the Foundation being so new, much of 2022 saw many firsts.

We started the year by opening our office at 201 E Main St, Suite 409 in downtown Washington. Before the first quarter ended, Purdue Extension - Daviess County was awarded the Foundation's first grant, for a new Cultural Diversity Training Program, and generous donors established the Foundation's first endowment, the Tom and Phyllis Miles/Washington Lady Hatchets Basketball Scholarship Fund.

During the summer, the Foundation was awarded accreditation with the nation's highest standard for philanthropic excellence, a major accomplishment and an accreditation that the Foundation will always strive to retain. National Standards for U.S. Community Foundations® establish legal, ethical, effective practices for community foundations everywhere. As was said by Randy Royster, board member of the Council on Foundations, "Meeting the National Standards benchmarks is a rigorous, comprehensive process. This accreditation is a significant accomplishment that indicates Our Community Foundation demonstrates a commitment to transparency, quality, integrity and accountability as it carries out its mission."

Following completion of all requirements of the Community Foundation Alliance's Separation Agreement, we made a formal request in September to transfer funds held by the Community Foundation Alliance for Daviess County to Our Community Foundation. We are hopeful that a response to this request will be received very soon.

Finally, with your continued support, the assets of Our Community Foundation alone, as a separate community foundation from the Alliance, grew to just over \$1.5 million by the end of our first full year of operations as the newest community foundation in Indiana. Please see our list of funds and donors on pages 5 and 6. Grants totaling \$12,555 were awarded, all made possible by donors to the Foundation's administrative fund. Both Board and staff are humbled and energized by your support to establish and operate a new standalone community foundation for Daviess County. We remain steadfast in our commitment to live our mission and to serve our donors and our community, now and in the years to come.

\$12,555 Total Grants

During 2022, Our Community Foundation awarded \$12,555 in grants. Total grants for each of the Foundation's 8 community need focus areas are listed in the chart. Using needs identified in the Daviess County Quality of Place and Workforce Development Plan, the Board approved grants for over \$4,000 in projects to develop Daviess County, including diversity training, beautification of public spaces, and literacy and STEM education, vital components of a growing community and workforce.

Pollinator Success





Last April, Our Community Foundation awarded a grant to the Guardians of the Garden Master Gardeners to establish an Educational Pollinator Garden at the Odon Winkelpleck Library. In July, we received notification and 2 photos from the group, advising us that the plants were thriving and hummingbirds and butterflies were visiting regularly.

We were thrilled with the news and the photo in the lower left corner, showing a butterfly visiting. The Garden provides both aesthetics and an opportunity for education. It serves adults and youth of northern Daviess County and is located near the outdoor WiFi area at the library.

According to the United States Department of Agriculture, 75% of flowering plants and over 1/3rd of the world's food crops depend on pollinators to reproduce. Some estimate that one out of every three bites of food we eat exists because of pollinators like bees,

butterflies and more. We were thrilled to support the Master Gardeners in this important project and look forward to seeing the garden come to life again this summer, and in the summers to follow.

GivingTuesday DaviessCounty ...fostering a Daviess County philanthropy culture

On November 29, during a 24-hour called Giving Tuesday, sixty-two donors gave donations totaling \$14,623.09 to 21 different Daviess County charitable organizations and 12 different funds benefiting Daviess County held by Our Community Foundation.


To help charities take part in Giving Tuesday, Our Community Foundation provided the structure through its website to manage on-line donations, all at no cost to the participating organizations. Donors made gifts to the nonprofits that chose to join in the event, called "GivingTuesday DaviessCounty."

In addition to the participating organizations, donors made donations to the charitable funds held by Our Community Foundation.

The support of Daviess County media pillars, Shake Broadcasting and the Washington Times-Herald, added to the event. Shake Broadcasting's George the GivingTuesday Gift Horse and the Washington Times-Herald's Herald the Helper Counting Troll made their first appearance to motivate organizations to spread the word.

"George was presented to the nonprofit raising the most money on Giving Tuesday," said DeWayne Shake with Shake Broadcasting. "He was presented to the United Way of Daviess County. That organization raised \$3,350 during the 24-hour event."

Washington Times-Herald Editor Lindsay Owens presented Herald to Little Warrior Wishes, a relatively new charitable organization in Daviess County with a mission to provide wish-granting experiences to families of children ages 0 to 3 years with a critical illness. "The organization's donors totaled 15 so the organization was very popular during the event," said Owens.
